White Oak: Features a tight, straight grain and is durable, water-resistant, and versatile, perfect for high-traffic areas.

BUFF & COAT

Buffing and coating your hardwood floors is a straightforward yet highly effective method to restore their beauty and protect them from wear and tear. Here's a step-by-step look at the process:

1. Preparation: The floor is thoroughly cleaned to remove any dust, dirt, or debris. This ensures a smooth surface for the buffing process.

2. Buffing: Using specialized equipment, the floor's surface is lightly sanded, removing minor scratches and surface imperfections. This step also prepares the floor for the fresh coat of finish by creating a smooth, receptive surface.

3. Coating: After buffing, a high-quality polyurethane or water-based finish is applied. This layer not only adds a lustrous shine but also provides a protective barrier against future damage.



How Often Should It Be Done?

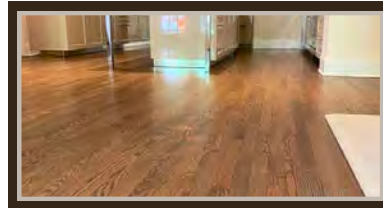
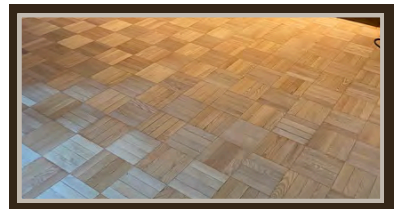
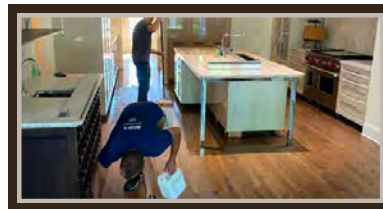
On average, we recommend buffing and coating your hardwood floors every 3 to 5 years. The exact frequency depends on:

- **Foot Traffic:** High-traffic areas (like hallways, kitchens, and living rooms) may need to be treated more frequently than lesser-used areas.
- **Floor Condition:** If you start to notice dullness, scratches, or fading, it's time to schedule a buff and coat service.

Why Different Woods and Finishes Matter

Not all hardwood floors are created equal, and that's where our expertise comes in. Different wood types and finishes require specific care:

- **Solid Hardwood:** Buffing and coating are perfect for this durable wood type, and can help maintain the rich, deep colors that many homeowners love.
- **Engineered Hardwood:** While engineered wood can also benefit from buffing, it typically has a thinner surface layer, meaning it can't be sanded as often as solid wood.
- **Oil-Based vs. Water-Based Finishes:** The type of finish applied matters too. Oil-based finishes take longer to dry but offer a rich amber glow, while water-based finishes are quicker to apply, environmentally friendly, and preserve the natural color of the wood.



Why You Should Buff and Coat

- **Extend the Lifespan of Your Floors:** Buffing and coating is an essential maintenance step that can significantly extend the life of your hardwood floors, delaying the need for a full refinish.
- **Maintain Aesthetic Appeal:** Over time, hardwood floors can lose their shine and develop small imperfections. Buffing and coating restores the original beauty, making your floors look as good as new.
- **Protection Against Wear:** Regular foot traffic, furniture movement, and daily activities can wear down your floor's finish. Buffing and coating adds a fresh layer of protection, guarding against further damage.
- **Cost-Effective Solution:** Compared to a full refinishing, buffing and coating is far more affordable and less invasive, as it doesn't require complete sanding down to the wood.



POST-REFINISHING FLOOR CARE



1. Initial Care:

- **Avoid Walking on the Floor:** Allow the finish to cure for at least 24 hours before walking on the floor. For the first 48 hours, only soft-soled shoes or socks should be worn to prevent any damage.
- **Replace Furniture:** Wait at least 48 hours before replacing furniture. When doing so, lift the furniture rather than dragging it to avoid scratches. Use felt pads under the legs of furniture to prevent damage.
- **Rugs and Mats:** Avoid placing area rugs on the floor for the first two weeks to ensure the finish cures completely.

2. Regular Cleaning:

- **Sweeping and Dusting:** Use a soft-bristle broom or a microfiber dust mop to remove dust and dirt regularly. Avoid using a vacuum with a beater bar as it can scratch the floor.
- **Mopping:** Clean the floors using a damp (not wet) mop with a hardwood floor cleaner recommended by the manufacturer. Avoid using water and vinegar, soap-based cleaners, wax, or steam cleaners as they can dull the finish and damage the wood.

3. Preventive Measures:

- **Furniture Pads:** Install felt pads on the bottom of all furniture legs to prevent scratches and scuffs.
- **Doormats:** Place mats at entryways to trap dirt and moisture. Ensure that the mats do not have a rubber backing, as it can trap moisture and damage the finish.
- **Pet Care:** Keep pets' nails trimmed to avoid scratches. Clean up any pet accidents immediately to prevent staining and damage.
- **Spill Management:** Wipe up spills promptly using a soft, dry cloth to prevent water damage or staining.

4. Environmental Control:

- **Humidity Levels:** Maintain indoor humidity levels between 30% and 50% to prevent the wood from expanding or contracting excessively. Use a humidifier or dehumidifier if necessary.
- **Sunlight Protection:** Use curtains or blinds to protect the floors from direct sunlight, which can cause fading and discoloration over time.

5. Long-Term Maintenance:

- **Professional Cleaning:** Have your floors professionally cleaned and recoated every 3-5 years, depending on the level of traffic and wear.
- **Avoid Harsh Chemicals:** Do not use harsh chemicals or abrasive cleaners on the floor as they can damage the finish.
